Much work has gone into a new member's database to record members' details including professions, addresses, fees and other housekeeping features. This will make the running of the society much more efficient and will help reduce costs as we begin the new millennium. We do thank all members for being patient as we have upgraded these facilities, as it has been time consuming and hard work, however will lead to a much more efficient society for us all.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The past year has been a busy one for AuSPEN as it continues to build on the hard work put in over the last few years to bring the society forward into the 21st Century and the era of rapidly advancing information technology. There is much to look forward to although the modern business environment and the demands of "best practice", which apply not only to our clinical work, but also to our business and clerical affairs, create new challenges for us. In the past the society has been a very successful and relaxed organisation with little need for great detail or documentation. Some of the day to day running of the society has happened with little organisation being required as a result of the efforts of a small number of dedicated members. These new challenges and the need to run an organisation as transparently as possible create new demands and the requirement for new procedures and processes.

This year has seen the development of the secretariat at ANZICS House in Rathdowne Street, Carlton so that the society now has a permanent home and contact numbers for members to be able to keep in touch with the organisation. At the present time the membership database is being updated largely due to the efforts of Ibolya Nyulasi and Liliana Sputore. This has proved to be an enormous task which has exposed great deficiencies in the old system that undoubtedly led to some members not receiving mail or newsletters and undoubtedly has lost us some members altogether. The new system will not only be more accurate but should permit a more rapid processing of new members

and the commencement of membership privileges. The database also gives us a greater ability to rapidly assess the state of the membership and the financial status of the society. There was clear message from the membership at last years AGM that they wished to retain the "Nutrition" journal as an important component of membership. The currency exchange rates have not been kind to us and we were forced to significantly increase membership dues to make sure that subscriptions covered the running costs of the society and the journal. Hopefully future increases will be smaller but this also has an adverse impact on membership numbers. Other costs have been minimised by the council meeting by teleconference and only meeting face to face at the AGM.

We are deeply indebted to Tom Hartley for his efforts in producing the newsletter over the past few years and for his access to electronic information in the nutritional field. One of the innovations of the technological era that we are about to embark on is an electronic newsletter which will be available to all members. There will also be a dedicated website for AuSPEN with general information about the society, members areas and links to other societies and organisations.

This year has also seen the society's name change from Australian to Australasian Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition but of course remaining AuSPEN. This change will hopefully reflect a greater presence of our society within the region that in turn will enhance our role in education and as an expert reference organisation



The annual scientific meeting on the Gold Coast last October was a highly successful meeting with truly outstanding guest speakers and was enjoyed by all who attended. This years meeting is being held outside a capital city in Lorne about 2 hours drive from Melbourne. The local

organising committee have worked hard to give us a stimulating programme and the venue will be outstanding. I encourage you all to support your society and attend the meeting. I look forward to catching up with many of you there in October.

- As written in the Adelaide Advertiser: South Australian medical scientist Professor Basil Hetzel was honored at an international meeting in Adelaide earlier this year for 40 years of work to prevent the world's biggest single cause of mental retardation. The meeting recognised the importance of work by Professor Hetzel which led to the adding of iodine to diet through salt. In the early days of AuSPEN Basil Hetzel was supportive. He was the keynote speaker at the 1977 Adelaide meeting.
